RS-1 delivered strongest in its

- **Economic momentum:** investments in high impact and HGHV sectors has supported the employment of nearly 4.0 million Selangorians, exceeding the target set for RS-1
- **Broad-based wellbeing:** Median household income in Selangor is the third highest in MY, relative poverty reduction and citizen satisfaction.
- **Natural capital stewardship:** Selangor has managed to maintain 24/7 clean water availability and Reserve Forest coverage was maintained at 31%

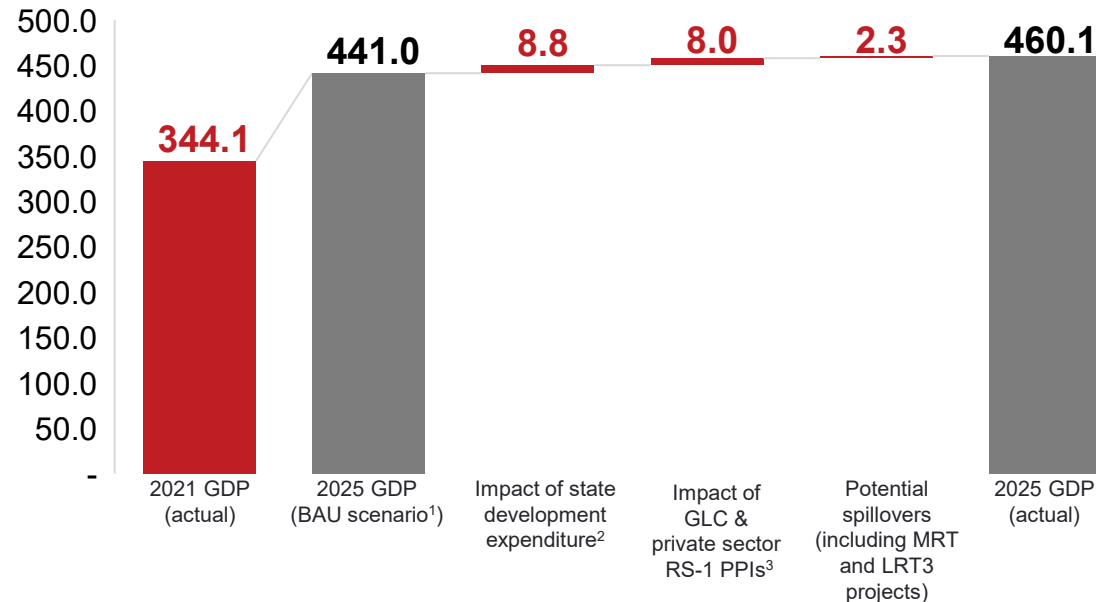
- **Last-mile broadband** and digital inclusion.
